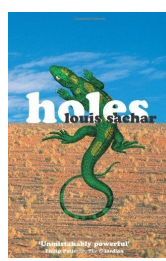

History: Crime and Punishment
Looking at Crime and Punishment across eras and comparing them. We will study multiple time periods and use our knowledge and understanding of the historical eras studied to make comparisons about crime and punishment.

Geography: North and South America.
Look at North and South America, comparing it to another area of the world. We will work to understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of a region in North America and South America in relation to another area of the world. Describe and understand key aspects of, Physical geography (e.g. climate zones, and vegetation belts) and Human geography (including types of settlement and land use, economic activity, including trade links and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water).

Living Things and their Habitats.
Describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including micro-organisms, plants and animals. Give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics.

Evolution and Inheritance
Describe how living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago, how living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents, and how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.
